

The Will of John Marshall (1803-1889)

I, John Marshall of the City of Parker in the County of Armstrong and State of Pennsylvania, being of sound mind, memory and understanding, do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.

As to such estate as it has pleased God to intrust [sic] me with, I dispose of the same as follows, viz:

I give and bequeath to my son **John T. Marshall** of the City of Parker, Armstrong County, Pa., all the property, real, personal or mixed of any kind or nature whatever, wheresoever the same may be, of which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease.

I nominate and appoint my son John Marshall of the City of Parker, Pa., to be the Executor of this my last will and testament.

In testimony whereof I, the said John Marshall, have to this my last will and testament subscribed my name and affixed my seal this thirty first day of December A. D. 1888.

John Marshall died at his home in Parker [formerly Lawrenceburg] on 07 September 1889. His family had moved to Lawrenceburg from Butler in the early 1830s. He is buried in the Marshall Plot of the Presbyterian Cemetery, a few blocks from his home of nearly 60 years. Beside him rest his wife Charlotte and his young son Freddie. Eventually, his daughter Mary Ann Marshall Turk, his sons Samuel T. Marshall, Elisha R. Marshall, and John T. Marshall would be buried near him, with many of their own family members. His son William K. Marshall is buried in Reynoldsville, Pennsylvania; and his son Henry M. Marshall is buried at the Andersonville National Cemetery in Georgia.
