

COUNTY YOUTH MET TRAGIC DEATH IN MARYLAND CAMP Funeral Rites Held Here Today For Wayne Marshall, Victim of Gasoline Fire

Funeral services will be held here this afternoon at the home of his sister, Mrs. Harold Dugan, of College avenue, for Wayne Marshall, aged 19, of Coal Run, Young township, who died on Saturday [16 November] in a hospital in Hagerstown, Md., from burns sustained in a gasoline explosion in the shower room of the Civilian Conservation Camp at Boonesboro [sic], Md. The funeral rites will be conducted by Rev. James Nelson, of Coal Run. The youth, who was a son of Guy R. Marshall, of Coal Run, was a former Indiana High school student, had been employed as a worker in the CCC camp at Boonesboro [sic] for about two weeks, having been transferred from the camp at Cook Forest. He leaves his father, four brothers and a sister, Mrs. Harold Dugan and Ralph Marshall, of town; Harold and Louis Marshall, residing at "home, and Herman Marshall, of Fort Washington, Md.
